For folks who are renting, don't run out and buy everything. Many of these can be borrowed from your home, backyard, boat, or family cabin.

This isn't about spending time and money doing everything the "right way". The goal is simply to be able to relax and enjoy every moment.

1. AN OUTDOOR RUG This not only gives a welcoming "front porch" feeling. A rug helps keep our chairs and tables a little bit more level and helps keep the floor cleaner inside our rigs. My favorite is the Courtyard series by SAFAVIEH.

2. SOLAR LIGHTS Nothing gives ambiance faster than lights at night. There are so many options now including table and string lights that are charged by both solar AND usb-cable so they are no longer weather dependant.

3. BISTRO SET Yes, we all want a proper table of some sort: to Cook on, Eat at, and to hold goblets at Happy Hour. My set folds up flat and slips into the storage. BONUS TIP: I use one of the chairs inside at my desk.

4. AWNING or UMBRELLA If your vehicle doesn't come with an awning, invest in an umbrella or pop-up freestanding shelter. Think Rain and Shade.

See my Rug, Table and Chair, Rolled-Up Awning, and yes, those are Solar Branches !

5. WATER PURIFIER This is necessary even if I am in an area with great water (because it flows through the water hose and holding tank). My favorite brand is CLEARLY as it removes 99% of PFAS's and Fluoride.

6. MULTIPLE COOKING DEVICES

I personally hate using propane indoors so I also have a small griddle (works w/ Jackery) and a larger MultiMaker grill (works w/ generator), both by DASH.

8. HAND VACUUM I use mine several times a day!

JACKERY Solar Generator Portable Power Station I have the 1000 watt with 2 Solar Panels. I would never travel without something like this again. It means I have up to 1000 watts of power ALL THE TIME! Even when I'm not plugged in.

The only thing I can't use it for is my Nespresso or the Air Conditioner. With it, I can easily cook, power my Starlink, and work outdoors. AND yes, folks tell me it works well with their CPAP machines too.

COZY BLANKETS & PILLOWS

RV's/van's aren't known for their thermal value. They get chilly at night. Plan to be cozy while reading, watching, or sleeping..

POWER BAR with a LONG cord.

The outlets are always in really awkward spots - either too high or just non-existent.

SHOE BINS and/or BASKETS Don't forget, our rigs don't have an entry or mud room for dirty shoes, dog leashes, or wet hats, Plan ahead with places to "dump stuff" .

13. GPS DRIVING APP for RV's

RV's don't drive like cars. They are taller. They don't like bumps. Believe me! I learned how scary it is to head into a tunnel and wonder if I was getting stuck. And I've rattled along for 2 tense hours on a road that would just have been mildly annoying in a car..

I suggest investing in **RV-specific travel apps like RV LIFE** that include trip planning and GPS routes that can be customized to a vehicle's specific size and needs. **Another of my favorite apps is DRIVE WEATHER.**

14. HARVEST HOST - BOONDOCKERS WELCOME

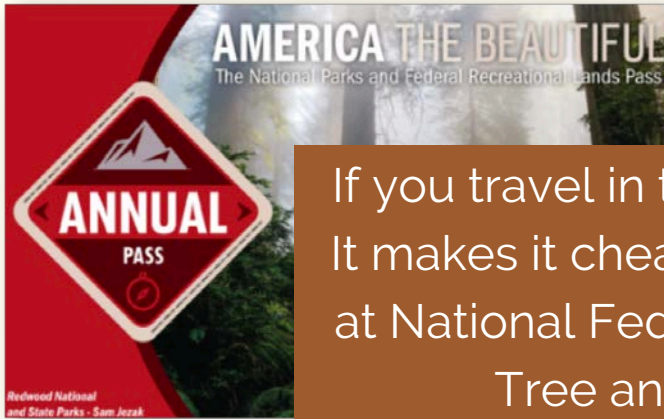
This is simply, my favorite membership!

DRINKING CUPS WITH LIDS! Seriously! I have had to scoop bugs out of so many drinks I even use wine goblets with lids now. BRUMATE is my favorite non-leak, non-dribble brand. I have several (including a martini shaker/coffee cup!) Great for gifts too!

BATTERY POWERED CANDLES

Nice ambiance at night and I just think real flames don't mix well with rv travel life.

STOVE TOP COFFEE MAKER or KETTLE

that can go on a propane stove since we don't always have power. Mine is by Grosch.

QUICK DRY TOWELS and HOOKS FOR THEM

Nothing in grosser than slightly damp, mildewy towels. Prevent this by using Turkish and/or microfiber towels. and make sure to have a spot to hang them to dry - inside and outside.

20. **AN ORGANIZATION**

SYSTEM of some sort. We need spots for pens, sunglasses, keys, wifi and bathroom codes for the RV park we're staying in - so much stuff!

21. **WI-FI**

This might be the biggest thing to research. If you are on holiday for a couple of weeks, not working, and are staying in your own country, you may get away with downloading LOTS of stuff before you leave home and rely on your phone and hot spots.

If you want to work, stream, game, or visit another country while on the road, you'll need to arrange some sort of system. Personal mobile hotspots (such as a Mi-Fi) may be available from your current phone carrier.

The other option is looking into a satellite system such as Starlink. This is what works best for me.

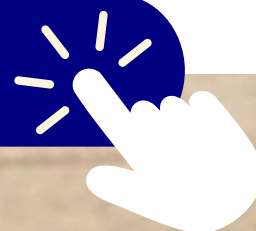
